About

The One Button Studio (OBS) is an automated video production space that allows its users to easily create high-quality videos without any prior experience with video production tools. This service has been brought to Southeast Missouri State University by the Heather MacDonald Greene Multimedia Center in Kent Library. The OBS was developed by Pennsylvania State University and was selected as one of the best new library services by the American Library Association (ALA) in 2014.

- Green screen recording
- Studio components of larger video assignments
- e-Portfolio introductions and content

For Faculty/Staff

- Delivering an introduction to an online course

Preparing for Your Visit

All you need is flash drive (FAT formatted) and an idea. HMGMC student consultants are available for assistance with formatting your flash drive and any other problem that may arise. Although not required, reservations can be made by contacting the HMGMC service desk at 573.986.4978 or at hmgmc@semo.edu. Otherwise, the studio is used on a first-come, first serve basis.

Using the OBS

- Insert your USB flash drive in the port to begin. The studio lighting will turn on as well as the recording software.
- When prompted, press the silver button to record.
- When you're finished, press the silver button again to stop recording.
- When prompted, remove your USB flash drive; the lights and recording software will turn off.
